There are no summer requirements for K - 2nd grades except to - **Read! Read! Read!**

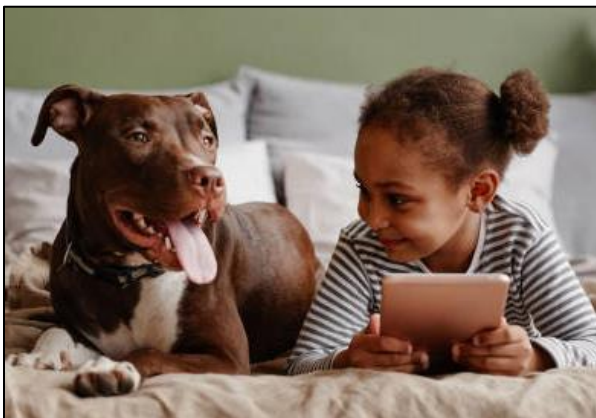
