Students should choose a book that is an appropriate reading level for them. Our school library will be open

Requirements:

- Each student must read at least 600 pages over the summer, and...
- Complete a **Book Response** for each book read (no more than three), to be handed in the first day of school.

Book responses should show what the book was about and what the student thought about the book. They can take the form of a book recommendation or review, a letter to a friend about the book, a 3-D project, a comic strip, or an artistic response. Encourage your student to have fun and be creative!

How Do I Choose a Good Fit Book?

7th and 8th graders should be able to choose books at their reading level. The book should not be too hard or too easy. Feel free to contact me for information on your child's reading level, and we can work together to select a book or series! The Scholastic Book Wizard and the Scholastic Summer Reading Challenge are also good resources.

How Can I Make Reading Fun?

Make reading a priority this summer by giving it the attention it deserves. Have your child read aloud to you, read a book together, or designate a set time each day when everyone reads. Encourage conversations about the book: how is a character's life similar/dissimilar to yours? Are they a good leader? Do you agree with their decisions? What do you think will happen in the end?
